Bangunan Sultan Ismail Guided Tour (1 to 2 hours)

Get an insider's look at the State Legislative Assembly Building, or Bangunan Sultan Ismail, as an experienced guide will take you around.

- **When**
Tours are held daily except Mondays and public holidays at 10am-12pm and 2pm-4pm. The rest of BSI is open to the public daily except Mondays and public holidays.
- **What to wear**
Please dress appropriately – sleeveless shirts, shorts and slippers are not allowed.
- **How much it costs**
RM30 for adults, RM15 for children.

Bookings must be made 24 hours in advance. Only 100 spots are available each day, so it is advisable to book early.

Johor Parliament Guided Tour (1 to 2 hours)

Experience Johor democracy in action firsthand at the State Legislative Assembly Hall at the Bangunan Sultan Ismail. Bookings must be made 3 days ahead of the session date. Only 25 seats are available for the public each day, so book early to ensure your spot.

- **When**
The next session following date in June will be announced in due course.
- **What to wear**
A formal dress code is strictly observed for the Johor Parliament Guided Tour. Only closed-toe shoes are acceptable. Casual clothing is not allowed e.g. *t-shirts, polo shirts, shorts, short skirts, sneakers, sandals, slippers*.

Ladies

- Long-sleeved blouse, long skirt below the knee and closed-toe shoes.
- Traditional Malaysian attire e.g. *baju kurung* or *kebaya labuh* and *tudung* or *head scarf*; *cheongsam*; *saree*.
- Muslim women are required to wear a head scarf.

Tour Information (cont.)

Gentlemen

- Lounge suit, long pants/slacks, tie and closed-toe shoes.
- Traditional Malaysian attire e.g. *baju melayu Teluk Belangah*, *samping*, *songkok* and closed-toe shoes.
- Muslim men are required to wear a *songkok*.

School children (6 years and above)

- School uniforms. For girls, skirts must be below the knee.
- ***How much it costs***
RM30 for adults, RM15 for children. No entry for children below age 6.
- ***Note***
Please provide your name in full and IC/passport number 3 days prior to your visit for security clearance.
- ***Conduct During Sessions***
 - Remain quiet.
 - No eating, drinking and smoking.
 - No photography.
 - Bow to the Speaker when taking your seat at the Public Gallery and upon rising from your seat to exit the Hall.
 - No cameras, mobile phones and other recording devices.
 - No weapons or dangerous items.

Qiblat Walk (1.5km)

Explore the “backbone” of Kota Iskandar on your own and see how the *Qiblat* axis guides the placement of all the main buildings.

1. Start at *Laman Firdaus* or Firdaus Garden to bask in the serenity and admire a sculpture there inspired by the *Qiblat*.
2. Walk through the Bangunan Dato' Jaafar Muhammad.
3. Stroll through Dataran Mahkota and check out the Heritage Wall to discover the State's glorious past.
4. Next stop is the Bangunan Sultan Ismail where you'll find the *Siar Jauhar* Gallery.
